The original name was Phi Gamma Delta but was changed to Tau Gamma Delta Sorority on October 17, 1951. On December 12, 1951 the Articles of Incorporation papers were filed with the Michigan Corporation and Commission to operate as a non-profit organization.

With several active graduate chapters across the United States, we continue to strive to achieve the standards and goals set forth by our Founders. Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc. plays an integral role in providing and contributing to numerous local and national services and programs within our communities to help combat society's issues of today.

- One week prior to the 58th Boule opening meeting, the National Webmaster will send an e-mail to every
 registered member which will include the URL and codes necessary to connect to the Zoom webinar,
 and an alternative and backup to the audio connection included within Zoom, the phone number and
 access code(s) that member needs to participate via the internet or by telephone.
- Each 58th Boule meeting will begin on time. The Zoom webinar service shall be available 20 minutes before the start of each meeting for all registered participants to sign in.
- All Plenary Sessions and National Officers' Meeting will begin at the following times: Western Region, 10:00am PST; Central Region, 12:00pm CST; Eastern Region, 1:00pm EST.; Supreme Directorate Meeting: 1:00pm PST /3:00pm CST/4:00pm EST.
- 4. Roll call and voting status will be given at the beginning of the first business session. The voting status shall be recorded by the Credentials Committee at each session and also recorded by the Supreme Grammateus and Supreme Basileus at the beginning of each session.
- 5. The chapter delegate and/or alternate delegate must be in attendance for each plenary session. Each chapter delegate must be prepared to vote how their chapter has advised on Constitution/Bylaws and Handbook changes that were circulated to chapters prior to Boule.
- One-third of the chapters represented in Boule shall constitute a quorum for Sorority business to be conducted. The Constitution/Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the voting delegates provided there is a quorum.
- Each member is responsible for her audio and internet connections; no action shall be invalidated on the grounds that the loss of, or poor quality of a member's individual connection prevents participation in the meeting. The sessions will be recorded.
- 8. The Chair and/or the Supreme Basileus may cause or direct the muting of a member's connection if it is causing undue interference with the meeting.
- 9. Protocol will be properly established at the first business session. Members presenting to the body shall address the "Founders, Supreme Directorate, Supreme Basileus, National Officers, and all Sorors assembled." No Soror is to be addressed by her first name. In recognizing any member, she shall be addressed, "Soror" and her last name.
- 10. To seek recognition of the Chair, a member shall use the raise hand feature or post a question in the chat feature. Upon obtaining the floor the member will address the chair and state her name and chapter. For members calling in on the telephone, will seek recognition by unmuting the phone, state her name and chapter and wait to be acknowledged by the presiding officer or Chair.
- 11. Questions or remarks on matters of business shall be limited to three (3) minutes but the time may be extended by a majority vote of the voting delegates.
- 12. A member intending to make a main motion, to offer an amendment, or to propose instructions to a committee, shall, after being recognized, announce the motion verbally, preceded by the member's name and chapter. For example, "Soror Smith, X Chapter, I moved that ..."

- The National Webmaster (or her designee) shall designate an online area exclusively for the display of the immediately pending question and/or main motion.
- Votes shall be taken by roll call or by poll voting. Business may also be conducted by unanimous consent.
- 15. The presiding officer shall rule out of order, any electronic questions, comments, proposals received not specifically related to the agenda for this webinar meeting.
- 16. All announcements shall be submitted to the Supreme Grammateus and/or Supreme Basileus in writing. The Supreme Grammateus shall present these announcements at the appropriate time during the meeting.
- 17. Hold all questions/comments on reports or presentations until the end of the report or presentation, unless the Supreme Basileus has identified them and will be accepting questions during the presentation.
- These Standing Rules may be rescinded, amended, or suspended by two-thirds vote of the voting delegates.
- 19. The current edition of Newly Revised Robert's Rules of Order (RONA), and the 'Sample Rules for Electronic Meetings' referenced in the 11th Edition of RONA, shall govern all proceeding of this meeting not provided for in the Constitution and Bylaws of Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Incorporated.

- Avoid using cellphone or landline for other than teleconference business

National Historian Report

Sorority Initiatives

Membership Numbers

Membership numbers are being developed for each soror. This will be a "6-DIGIT" coded system.

- First number will represent the region (1-Central, 2-Eastern, 3-Southern, 4-Western)
- Second and third numbers will represent the Chapter
- Fourth-Fifth-Sixth numbers will identify a soror in each Chapter. Sorors will be able to use their membership number to log into the sorority website.
- Membership Cards

New "plastic" memberships cards for each soror are almost finalized.

In August, membership numbers and cards will be presented to the Supreme Directorate for approval.

Membership Data-Base

There is a need to establish a sorority data-base. Such a system would be a vehicle to house sorority documents and provide readily access to each soror's history, skills, skills, resources, etc.

The data-base would eliminate excessive paperwork. For security purposes, information would not be a part of the sorority website.

Concerns:

- National Officers: The commitment of National Officers to perform duties during the sorority year needs improvement. When elected or appointed, the expectation is that one will perform all duties.
- Quarterly Reports: Chapters must submit all reports on time, Chapters must comply with and submit fines when reports are not timely.

<u>Discussion</u>: Consequences should be strictly imposed on chapters when reports are tardy. Changes in submission of reports may reflect changes to Handbook and Constitution -Bylaws

Suggestion:

Continue the use of email to send reports to the Supreme Directorate Chair, Supreme Basileus, 1st & 2nd Anti- Basili, and Regional Director. Hard copies should also be sent to Regional Directors.

- Central Region: Qualified candidates need to be identified to run for Central Regional Director. Leadership is needed.
- Auditing Committee: Sorority finances have not officially been audited for several years. Members with financial experiences are needed for this committee.
- Documentation:

There is a lack of documentation of chapters being registered in their state.

Many sorority / chapter documents are currently illegible and / or unavailable. This supports the need for a viable sorority database.

 Awards: Chapters need to submit paperwork for Sorority Awards. Awards reflect the positive accomplishments of sorors and chapters.

A smaller replica of the Ballard Award Trophy for "Chapter of the Year" has been purchased. Tau Chapter (Philadelphia) was the only chapter applying for this award for two consecutive Boules. 16 Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc. "Illuminating the Pathway"

< Soror Fayette Caffie, Tau: Only \$1000 was given to the Scholarship recipient. The National recipient should not receive less than \$1500.00.

Soror Linda McClellan, Rho: When errors are mede they should be corrected. Since there was not prior knowledge of this error, Soror McClellan made the following motion; It was moved by that the scholarship recipient be given the additional \$500.00, seconded by Soror Lynette Banks Lightfoot. Voting Strength 37; Motion Passed.

TAU GAMMA DELTA SORORITY, INC. NATIONAL THEME: REACHING OUR VISION THROUGH SISTERHOOD AND SERVICE 58th Boule via Zoom Webinar REPORT OF THE SUPREME DIRECTORATE

Fellow members of the Supreme Directorate, Founder Parnell, Supreme Basileus Caffie, National Officers and Sorors:

If anything 2018-2020 has taught us to be prepared and to understand that at any given moment something or someone may 'move the cheese.'

During the 2018-2020 sororal year the Supreme Directorate has been active by doing our best to assist the Supreme Basileus in "Reaching our Vision through Sisterhood and Service".

Beginning in August 2018 we conferred with past supreme Directorate Chair, Soror Ann Taylor to make the transition by completing tasks and recommendations from the 57th Boule Supreme Directorate meeting.

We have been included in and actively participated in conversations, teleconferences, and decisions made regarding a number of unforeseen circumstances that insured we would not be doing TGD business as normal. Such as the Sorority House challenges of water damage, the insurance assessment, the decision to sell the property and the actual selling of the property, the website crash, and for the first time that I know of the resignations of sorors in elected National Office positions. Lastly of course, the effect of the pandemic on the planning of the 58th Boule.

We have collaborated with the Supreme Basileus as well as the First and Second Anti-Basili to stay up to date on regional and chapter activity and we have often received Quarterly Reports from the Regional Directors.

We have been supportive of Sorors and chapters by mailing cards of sympathy and cheer. For the first time that I know of a sitting Supreme Basileus experienced the transition of an immediate family member and approved purchase of a plant to be sent on behalf of the sorority. We sent congratulatory message to new sorors and greetings to be read during Regional Conferences. As well, we reached out from time to time to encourage a few of our National officers.

During the 2018-2019 sororal year as chairperson I communicated with the other Supreme Directorate members with a quarterly update newsletter. When needed ballots were mailed as a method to gather their votes for certain issues such as the approval of simple updates to forms to make them more user friendly in an ever changing world. These changes/ updates/revisions may have been as simple as adding a date line or for example in the case of the jewelry form to update the cost of the jewelry.

During the 2019-2020 sororal year as chairperson while continuing to send mailers I began to meet more often via teleconference to research, discuss and render decisions, memorandums authorizations and directives to allow the Supreme Basileus to carry out her duties and objectives. In recent months we began to meet using platforms such as Google Meets and Free Conference.com video conferencing.

Our meetings also led to seven recommendations for amendment to the Constitution and Bylaws. These recommendations fall under four basic topics: (1) Name Order for Chapter Charters, (2) National Office Slate Vacancies, (3) Contingency Policy and (4) Addressing Low Chapter membership. They are as follows:

Background:	At the request of the Supreme Basileus the Supreme Directorate reviewed the Chapter Charter List and recommends that the next five names [following Upsilon Omega for the Alabama Chapter]

Currently Reads:	Graduate chapters shall be named after the letters of the Greek alphabet in order of establishment until the twenty-fourth chapter is established and the twenty-four letters of the alphabet exhausted. Then Omega shall become the base letter for the name of each chapter e.g. Alpha Omega, until the twenty fourth chapter is established.	
Modification:	Graduate chapters shall be named after the letters of the Greek alphabet in order of establishment until the twenty-fourth chapter is established and the twenty-four letters of the alphabet exhausted. Then Omega shall become the base letter for the name of each chapter e.g. Alpha Omega, until the twenty fourth chapter is established. Rationale:	To avoid confusion, mix-up and challenge of memory we will start fresh by repurposing Alpha. Alpha names were originally used for the undergraduate chapters. Undergraduate chapters were abolished several years ago.

Constitution & Bylaws

Background:	The National Graduate Organizer does not have a budget yet is expected to scout and assist Regional Directors from coast to coast in organizing new chapters. The coast of travel, of outreach to newspapers and other public relations efforts have increased in cost yet this officer does not have a budget. It would be a great support to have assistance from sorors of a region who know their region's landscape and possible opportunities/areas for growth.
Amends:	Regions- Article V-Section 2a Duties [C&B p 36 - 37]
Currently Reads:	The duties of the Regional Directors are numbered 3-5. This will add to the duties of the Regional Director.
Modification:	The Regional Director will appoint a Soror to serve as the Regional Liason to the Graduate Organizer. The Regional Liaison to the Graduate Organizer will assist the Graduate Organizer seeking interest and contacts in the cities within the region for the purpose of building new chapters. Whenever a new chapter is installed within the region she shall assist the National Graduate Organizer in the logistical planning of the Inauguration.
Rationale:	Rather than eliminate the position of Graduate Organizer, each region will appoint a Soror to serve as Regional Liaison to the Graduate Organizer. This Soror is to assist the Graduate Organizer by seeking interest and contacts in the cities within the region for the purpose of building new chapters.

Background:	It is of great concern to the Supreme Directorate that the membership of the sorority is not growing. We have discussed and brainstormed the many factors that may have led to what we see when looking at the Quarterly reports. We do not want to keep losing chapters. It is however a natural by-product to stagnant growth. Also we want to be more sisterly about helping, encouraging and nurturing each other. Someone said, "The potential of an organization rests on the strengths of its people." Our strength should be in our sisterhood. We strongly suggest that when Regional Directors notice while reading the quarterly reports that any chapter in her region appears to be struggling with membership and with implementing the National programs to please take time to help someone along the way.	
Amends: Chapter Obligations & Reports Article VII.D Section 1 (C&B		
Currently Reads:	Currently does not include specific language regarding how many members are needed to maintain a chapter once it has been chartered	
Modification: Recommendation	Each local chapter will maintain a minimum membership of five. When a chapter's membership falls below five during any sororal year efforts should be made to increase it to the minimum by the next Boule.	
	Should the chapter fail to increase its membership by Boule the Supreme Directorate will recommend that the chapter be placed into Probation status. During probation status the chapter will retain all chapter rights accorder to it by the Constitution and Bylaws	
	Should a chapter's membership fail to increase by Boule the Supreme Directorate will place the chapter in probation status. The chapter will then have two years [Boule to Boule] to increase membership. Should the chapter be unable to increase its membership to a minimum of five members by the following Boule the Board will recommend to the body that the chapter be placed on inactive status. Its members will be given the opportunity to transfer into another chapter or to become Members-at-Large.	

Rationale:	If five ladies are needed to start a chapter and five members are needed to have one vote at Boule, would it not stand to reason that five members would be the minimum needed to sustain a chapter? Although a chapter may be able to function with less by paying the fees and not actively engaging in the National programs or in some cases even actively engaging in the National programs; what happens to the chapter if/when members become ill or transition?

REPORT OF THE SUPREME BASILEUS

To our Founder, Supreme Directorate, National Officers, and Sorors of Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Incorporated:

It has been a privilege and an honor to serve as your Supreme Basileus. There were some expected challenges along the way, and unexpected ones as well. However, the challenges we faced created opportunities to accomplish the goals to move Tau Gamma Delta Sorority forward. I have executed the duties and responsibilities of the office of Supreme Basileus to the best of my abilities. The first of my duties among several is to manage all the units of the sorority effectively to create harmony, love and respect among the sorors. The collaborative efforts of our National Officers' working as a unified team is the main reason for our success these last two years.

Membership growth has been the focus of the Sorority for a long time. The progress to add new members has been slow and a major concern. The total number of members has been range bound for several years despite efforts in this area. As new members had joined the sorority, we had members go inactive resulting in no increase in the totals. There is now an urgency for every chapter to bring in new members, and not lose members. We celebrate our members who have joined since the last Boule, and new chapter Upsilon Omega, inaugurated November 2019.

There were two major accomplishments in 2019-2020: the first, was the sale of the Sorority House. The Sorority was able to sell the House and also recoup losses for property damages before the sale. Second, we accomplished the successful upgrades to the website and to bring the site back online. We made progress on updating sorority forms, pledge manual, and the Star Newsletter posted on the site. We plan to design and make new enhancements to the website in the future.

At the National Officers' Meeting in August 2019, there were 7 new sorority initiatives proposed:

Initiative #1Redesign Sorority Membership CardInitiative #2Create a National Membership DatabaseInitiative #3Assign a Member Number to every Soror

Initiative #4Reprint Sorority Handbook or post onlineInitiative #5Develop a Standardized Virtual Rush PowerPoint ToolInitiative #6Develop a National Online Voting/Survey ToolInitiative #7Design Enhancements for the Sorority Website

I am proud to announce progress on the redesigned membership card and member numbers created for every soror. These designs will be submitted to the Supreme Directorate for review and approval. The immediate goal for member numbers is to be able to log onto the website using a personal member number. Plans to place the Sorority Handbook on the website are moving forward. The Sorority has started to use online tools such as the online poll for voting used in September 2019, and the Boule online registration form in June 2020.

There were some administrative duties and oversight responsibilities that I was not able to get to in the last two year. The first, to attend the regional conferences, and second, provide more guidance and direction to the Regional Directors to ensure that the regions and chapters were operating uniformly according to the Constitution/ Bylaws, procedures and protocols. One of the duties of the Supreme Basileus is to exercise supervision over the four Regional Directors and their Assistants to ensure the chapters under their respective jurisdiction are operating according to the laws and regulations of the sorority. Another area I was unable to review, is the Tauette Club program; the handbook, forms, etc., and if the goals of the program are being achieved. A full review of how we are mentoring young girls is important for the Sorority to be instrumental in producing the next generation of our future leaders.

The unprecedented coronavirus pandemic has forced everyone to adjust to a 'new normal'. The duration of COVID-19 is unknown. Due to lack of Federal government leadership and a national plan to deal with the virus, all businesses, organizations and citizens must figure out what the 'new normal' will be and how to live with the virus for now. TGD will continue to use technology to move our organization ahead. All sorors must learn to adapt to these changes.

The Supreme Basileus expenses for 2019 and 2020 have been submitted to the Supreme Epistaleus with all vouchers and receipts for reimbursement.

Thank you for your confidence in me, and your support, and the opportunity to serve as the Supreme Basileus of Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc.

I was asked by the Supreme Basileus to handle the concerns of the Sorority House in February 2019. As First Anti-Basileus I have tried to execute the duties and responsibilities of this office in a businesslike and professional manner. In working with the Chapters of Tau Gamma Sorority, Inc., I find that communication is a key factor in the success of this office as well as the responsibility of Chapters sending reports in on time.

During my tenure as Supreme first Anti-Basileus, I have the responsibility as the National Chairperson of Founder's Day, and the Scholarship Committee according to our Constitution and By-Laws. Also, chaired the Sorority House Task Force Committee. In addition, to compile a National roster of Scholarship recipients. I wish to thank Soror Dixon for her hard work on our website over the years, she and her team were instrumental in the redesign and relaunch of our website in 2014. I appreciate all of her assistance in the transfer of her duties and hope to be able to fill the big "heels" that she left.

The National Webmaster shall develop, design and maintain the website. She shall upload all pertinent information and keep the website current.

<u>www.taugammadeltasororityinc.com</u> was taken offline on January 22, 2019 due to being compromised. We hired a consultant to guide us through the process of getting the site cleaned of malware and back up and running. The website was brought back online on March 22, 2020.

In the process of bringing the website back online, I installed a new WordPress theme, Neve and updated all 44 pages on the website to be compatible with the new theme. Greetings Founder, Supreme Directorate, Supreme Basileus, National Officers, and Members.

Thank you for another opportunity to serve as your National Historian. This year has been challenging and rewarding. We discovered that we are adaptable (successfully holding meetings with zoom). We are tenacious, enabled, and committed to doing good work in our communities. We are survivors dedicated to maintaining our health. We are supported in our efforts by Soror Fayetta Caffie, our National President, who will not quit. She was undaunted as she dealt with the selling of our Sorority House and the reconstruction of our website while trying to hold regional and national meetings during a pandemic.

The attached spreadsheet reflects the data collected from the submission of the History Chapter Report 28. Thirteen reports were received from the chapters with one exemption (Upsilon Omega). I did not receive reports from Phi, Kappa, or Omicron. Due to the pandemic, several national activities were canceled due to stay at home orders, but some regions were successful in holding Zoom meetings to conduct business. We were successful in raising and donating \$19,400 for scholarship and charity awards.

I initiated a proposal with the help of Soror Selena Richardson and the blessings of the Supreme Basileus and Supreme Directorate to capture the history of our Founder, Juanita Parnell, unfortunately, this initiative had to be tabled because of the pandemic. We hope to complete the project when the pandemic is over, and we have returned to a new normalcy.

I still have concerns that the reports I receive do not sufficiently reflect all our history or activities we are involved in and that we don't have a safe and accessible repository. We are unable to access documents from the past that we need presently. To do justice to our future growth and development, we take the necessary steps to expand our gathering of information that includes operational growth like social media and a national website, functional changes like the selling of the Sorority House and historical changes like surviving a pandemic. I have begun researching ways to make changes to how we collect, report, and retain our history. I am providing my recommendations on a separate sheet for consideration.

Respectfully submitted, Sharee Wharton Recommendations: A working committee needs to be established to review the Chapter History Reports to update the report to include ways to record organizational changes and historical changes.

The Supreme Basileus and National Officers should continue their investigation of fraternity/ sorority membership databases to include a repository for storing individual chapter history that is maintained in the cloud and can be easily accessed as needed. This should include all legal documents that belong to individual chapters.

The working committee should develop new guidelines that chapter historians can follow in reporting individual chapter history to include the tracking of individual achievements and major contributions to our society.

The website site should have a historical section that traces our history from its beginnings.

A previous communication sent on January 15th determined this was a technical computer program software issue and not membership committee which consist of novice literate individuals. The membership can be instrumental in identifying the categories of the MIS system. Conversation to include Supreme Basileus, sorors on technology and/or website, and membership committees that have the skills to create what is being requested. (Note: a poll taken of membership committee members one has a working knowledge of excel the other limited computer skills. Committee is stagnant and needs clarity to move forward.
- Recommends the Membership Data System goes to the Supreme Directorate for approval since this would change how we operate and would be a system that would become mandatory under someone's job description.



To our Founder, Supreme Directorate, Supreme Basileus, National Officers, Regional Directors, and members of Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc.

As you know the Sorority house incurred severe damages in February 2019. I was asked by the Supreme Basileus to handle the concerns of the House. The House was severely damaged due to a crack in the tank of the second-floor bathroom. This caused structural and water damage throughout the House. Several companies were sent in through the Insurance Company to evaluate the condition of the Sorority House.

At the National Officers meeting the Supreme Basileus received a letter from the Supreme Directorate Chair to sale the house. During the meeting, I was asked to proceed in the process of selling the Sorority House.

Mr. Briggs, Realtor was contacted to see if he would represent Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc., in selling the Sorority House. Paperwork was sent from his office and forwarded to the Supreme Basileus for her signature. At that point, the House was put on the market for sale.

During this time Tau Gamma Delta had to make sure that all bills were paid.

Several months latter Tau Gamma Delta Sorority had an offer from Mrs. Cecile Massey of Carry the Word Ministries, a non-profit organization for \$11,000 as is. The Supreme Basileus was notified to see if Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc., would accept this offer.

The Supreme Director and Supreme Basileus discussed this offer and gave permission to inform the Realtor that Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc., accepts the offer.

The Seller Agreement was sent out and forwarded to our Supreme Basileus to view, have notarized, and signed by her. The closing took place on November 12, 2019. Shortly after that the title company sent a check for \$6, 144.20 to the Sorority, which is currently in escrow. The balance after the Realtor, Title company and other fees were taken out of the \$11,000.

Since the House was sold, my final duty was to inventory the items of Tau Gamma Delta that is currently in storage. I, along with the Supreme Basileus had booked our tickets to go to Detroit in April to complete this task. This trip was cancelled due to Covid-19. Prayerfully, this task will be completed within the next Sorority year. Also, Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, Inc., needed an address for our mail, therefore, a Post office box was opened by Soror Richardson. This will serve as our Headquarters for now. I would like to thank Soror Richardson for the work that she completed in packing and having our files and other items moved into the Storage Unit.
